If you get separated from the main party, the route cards will tell you where we are going and indicate an outline of our route, and may help you locate any public transport, used in conjunction with the alternative transport list. It is a good idea to take a map case with you to keep your route cards in, together with leaflets and postcards etc that you may pick up at churches en route - even if you do not carry a map.

DAY 1 Saturday August 9 Commissioning and Horley to Reigate 8.8 miles

LEADER: Maurice Hickman Maps: L187 or E146

Today we gather for the start of the pilgrimage. See the separate document with instructions for how to walk from Horley Station to the Catholic Church. There, after we have registered, Bishop Richard Moth of Arundel and Brighton will lead our Gathering and Welcome service.

The walk today involves crossing several busy A and B roads but the route has been so designed that all these can be crossed at pedestrian lights. However, where you have to be extra careful is in crossing at the road junctions between the lunch stop and the church stop in Earlswood. St John the Evangelist Church dominates the skyline in the Earlswood area with its attractive tall spire. Just before the Mass at Reigate we shall pass through the castle grounds which are accessed via the steps from the High Street.



Profile (Scale 0 to 400 ft): Each day the route card shows the route profile. But don't be misled: be aware that it is a different scale each day! Today starts off flat then we find some small hills around Redhill and Reigate.

DAY 2 Sunday August 10 Reigate to Ashtead 10.1 miles

LEADERS: Sue & Fred Adilz Maps: L187 or E146

The morning walk climbs the scarp slope of the North Downs and traverses Colley Hill, with views over Surrey and Sussex. We cross the M25 and head down the side of Walton Heath Golf Course to Dorking Road (cross with care). Around the first hole of the Old Course, we head up the passage to our church of St Peter's Walton on the Hill. Coffee is served before the service. After lunch at the Blue Ball, we leave Walton and head through Langley Vale Memorial Wood, an area of downland commemorating WW1, planted with 180,000 trees. The area was used for army training and a camp in WW1. Kitchener visited the troops in 1915. We follow tracks though Beech Wood into Ashtead, before visiting St Giles and arriving at the hall. Please cross all roads at marked points with great care.

Note that we are split between 2 halls this evening; we arrive at the halls mid-afternoon. For those wanting something extra, there are 6pm services available to attend in both Anglican churches in Ashtead: St Giles' (traditional) and St George's (contemporary)



A&B Pilgrimage History: The very first pilgrimage in 1975 also stopped for lunch at The Blue Ball on its Epsom to Caterham day, but other than that this is an all-new route. The pilgrimage has never visited Ashtead before.

Profile (Scale 0 to 700 ft): Today we see a steep climb to the top of Colley Hill then it is mostly downhill all the way.



DAY 3 Monday August 11 Ashtead to Weybridge 14.6 miles

LEADERS: Claire & Julian Glover

Maps: L187, L176 or E146, E161, E160

We walk from Ashtead, via Ashtead Common, Prince's Covert and Claygate Common to Claygate where we make a prayer stop and take lunch. Afterwards, we cross Esher Common and West End Common before crossing the River Mole to the West of Esher. Next, we pass an equestrian centre and golf course before heading through Walton on Thames and making a prayer stop. Finally, we follow the Thames Path to the end of the walk in Weybridge. In general, paths are easy going - a mix of tracks, paths and bridleways with generally good surfaces. There is also some pavement walking in Ashtead, Claygate, Walton and Weybridge.



DAY 4 Tuesday August 12 Weybridge to Frimley 17.5 miles

LEADER: Simon Dommett Maps: L176, L175 or E160, E145

Today is a scenic, story-rich day route from Weybridge to Frimley, divided into three parts. It blends waterways, literary landmarks, tranquil green spaces, and quiet trails past military zones - perfect for a thoughtful day's pilgrimage. The first leg, Weybridge to Woking is tranquil and easy going, with boats, swans and wide skies. The second leg Woking to West End opens your imaginations with the peace garden and Horsell Common, the famed landing site of the Martians in War of the Worlds. The final section takes us safely past the military training area, reminding us war is never far away.



Profile (Scale 0 to 400 ft): Fairly flat until we climb to 400ft above sea level on the edge of the army ranges.

DAY 5 Wednesday August 13 Frimley to Farnham 12.2 miles

LEADERS: Danny Thomas & Mark Potter

Generally flat ground today, with a mixture of road and off-road footpaths. Leaving St Francis' Church, Frimley in the morning, we head to Frimley Green – about 2 miles – and soon after have our first prayer stop at the Methodist Church. After this, the walk joins the Basingstoke Canal towpath and we follow this, leaving it only for our lunch stop, then continue along the canal until we take the Blackwater Valley path – beside the noisy main road - to the outskirts of Aldershot. Here we continue on the same path which becomes gradually quieter as we approach Badshot Lea and the semi-rural Tice's Meadow. Following an afternoon prayer and drinks stop, we head into Farnham, skirting round the busy Shepherd and Flock roundabout, where a marshal will be posted to help everyone cross a dual carriageway. Walking along the relatively quieter road into Farnham and through the local park, after crossing the busy A31, we head over the level crossing and up to St Joan of Arc Church, our destination.



A&B Pilgrimage History: Today is all completely new territory, not crossing any previous routes, until we reach Farnham, a place where many of our routes converge. The first pilgrimage in 1975 was planned from Farnham where Fr Bill Haynes was a curate. The 1975, 1976, 1983, 1994 and 2005 pilgrimages all stayed overnight in Farnham.

Profile (Scale 0 to 300 ft): A very flat day indeed!



DAY 6 Thursday August 14 Rest Day in Farnham 0 miles

Today is a rest day and so free time for pilgrims. It is also free time for the support team, so the only meal provided is breakfast. Pilgrims will go out to eat and/or bring takeaways back to the hall. But note that we are attending the parish Vigil Mass of the Assumption at 18.30 as we will not be celebrating mass tomorrow morning on the feast day itself.

What to do in Farnham? There is the leisure centre, across the A31 and the river, which we passed close to at the end of yesterday's walk. Public swimming sessions 12.00-13.00 and 15.00-16.00. Close to the leisure centre is the cinema. In town is the museum. Unfortunately Farnham Castle is closed to visitors in 2025 but there is the 230-acre Farnham Park with a kilometre-long avenue of trees. The nearest launderette is 2 miles away to the north in Heath End. Buses 18/19 from the station take you most of the way there or if you want to walk all the way, one route is across Farnham Park. Or catch the train to Aldershot and walk half a mile to the Clean 4 U launderette (also served by 18/19 buses).

DAY 7 Friday August 15 Farnham to Haslemere 12.4 miles

LEADER: Bruce Matheson Maps: L186 or E145,OL33

After we leave the church in the busy streets near the railway station, both the trees and the houses grow huge. The first church stop is in the suburbs then we zig zag across a mixture of forest and heathland on the sandy soils familiar from previous pilgrimages. Soon after the bridge over the River Wey we pass the busy Tern Cafe on Frensham Little Pond. More mixed commons follow with a glimpse of the Rushmore estate mansions. There is a brisk climb up to the Tilford viewpoint which is a good place to eat your rolls. Soon after the hill, we reach Bel & the Dragon for a drink. Those wanting a posh lunch should order on the Tuesday before (Bruce will obtain the menus). There is a mile of road walking to follow before we turn south along the farm lanes and then up on to the ridge to Hindhead. There is a prayer stop at a memorial then maybe a cup of tea at the cafe. Another long ridge walk takes us to the edge of Haslemere and then to tonight's church.



A&B Pilgrimage History: The first pilgrimage in 1975, travelling in the opposite direction, passed the other side of Frensham Little Pond on the way into Farnham. The 2016 pilgrimage went close to the Hindhead NT Cafe, travelling west to east. We have stayed in the Haslemere Methodist Church before, in 1986, but not the Catholic Church.

Profile (Scale 0 to 900 ft): Today's maximum height is reached above the Devil's Punchbowl in Hindhead. It is not quite as high as tomorrow's maximum.



DAY 8 Saturday August 16 Haslemere to Midhurst 16.2 miles

LEADER: Richard Morris Maps: L186, L197 or OL33

From Haslemere, we climb up to Black Down and visit the "Temple of the Winds", the highest point in Sussex. Later we pass through flower planted meadows and hopefully see innumerable butterflies on the way to Midhurst.

On reaching Midhurst, we go straight to the Catholic church for the Vigil Mass of Sunday and then we eat our supper in the Catholic church hall, before dispersing to the 2 halls that we are sleeping in.





A&B Pilgrimage History: The first days of the 1975, 1976, 1980 and 1991 pilgrimages all stopped for prayers at St James Heyshott on their way from Arundel to Midhurst. The 1981 pilgrimage visited All Saints in East Dean. The 1978 and 2007 pilgrimages visited Boxgrove Priory. We have never been to Tangmere!

Profile (Scale 0 to 800 ft):Today's maximum elevation is 750ft when we cross the South Downs way, not quite as high as the previous 2 days.

DAY 10 Monday August 18 Tangmere to Goring 21.1 miles

LEADER: George Carpenter

This is our longest walk this year but generally easy going; some slight hills but not too steep. It splits into 4 sections of about 5 miles each. Much of the walk goes through woods in the earlier sections. Between Slindon and Arundel, Rewell Wood can be confusing and easy to get lost in. There is field walking later on, be careful of barbed wire lying on the ground. There is no phone signal in Slindon. The route goes through Arundel, which is a historic and beautiful town, with prayers at the Cathedral. After Angmering Park there is a very fast road crossing on the A280 and marshals will be used at this point. After that we go up and over Highdown Hill, and we have to pass through an area where heavy vehicles are marshalled - keep to the segregated path and make sure you are visible. We immediately cross Titnore Lane - a minor road with fast traffic, just be patient and stay alive. Goring is part of the Worthing conurbation, so there is quite a bit of street walking before the railway bridge that takes you to the church where we're staying.



Profile (Scale 0 to 300 ft): We make some excursions into the foothills of the South Downs before and after crossing the River Arun. The maximum height of the day is reached in the woods of Michelgrove Park after lunch.



DAY 11 Tuesday August 19 Rest Day in Goring 0 miles

It's our second rest day but where are we staying exactly? We are in Goring-by-Sea United Reformed Church but right next door are Durrington-on-Sea railway station and Worthing Leisure Centre! Our main event today is located one mile to the west of the hall in the English Martyrs Catholic Church which is definitely in Goring-by-Sea. This church is famous as its ceiling has been painted as a copy of the Sistine Chapel ceiling. Therefore we will be attending the parish mass at 09.30 and after that we have arranged a tour to fully appreciate the ceiling. Pilgrims could stop off at the launderette on the way there or on the way back. See details below. There are other launderettes in different directions but slightly further.

The leisure centre is next door but it does not have a swimming pool. For those wanting a swim, the beach (pebbles not sand) is ¾ of a mile to the South or you can catch the train to Worthing and go to the Splashpoint Leisure Centre close to the sea front. Those wanting an excursion could catch the train to Brighton or other places.

DAY 12 Wednesday August 20 Goring to Brighton 17.9 miles

This is an 18 mile walk with 6 prayer stops, much road walking, 1 big hill & 2 smaller ones. We climb twice to reach Lancing College, then descend to River Adur, crossing Old Toll Bridge to Shoreham. Lunch is near St Mary de Haura Church with 5 eateries to choose from. After St Julian's Church we cross Shoreham Port Anchor Point Lock gates. There follows a tedious stretch by hidden seashore which improves as we near Portslade & Hove. Then uphill passing the Cardinal Newman School on the way to Preston Park. We have a prayer stop in the school because pilgrimage co-founder Fr Bill Haynes was chaplain at that school which led to very many of the students becoming pilgrims, while legendary pilgrimage cook Frances Dean taught there.





Profile (Scale 0 to 600 ft): A big climb near the start while still on the streets of Brighton to reach maximum altitude on Newmarket Hill. Then down to walk along by the River Ouse after lunch then severa smaller ups and downs at the end.



DAY 14 Friday August 22 Seaford to Eastbourne 16.2 miles

LEADER: Gary O'Brien Maps: L198,L199 or OL25

Today's walk starts off being hilly as we climb out of Seaford and go along the South Downs way. On reaching Cuckmere Haven we go in land and reach the Seven Sisters Country Park. We then have more hills to climb (some of those sisters!) before we use the Crowlink path to take us to Friston and our lunch stop at The Tiger Inn at East Dean. After lunch we have prayers at East Dean Church. We then follow a flatter inland route which takes us through Eastbourne Downs Golf course and into Eastbourne. 


DAY 15 Saturday August 23 Celebration Day in Eastbourne 0 miles
