Directions

Our first night's accommodation is Marton Methodist Church on The Grove, off Stokesay Road, just 200m from the The Marton Hotel & Country Club Bus Stop (served by buses 28, 28A, 28B, 29 and 29A from Middlesbrough Bus Station, itself 15 minutes walk from the railway station) or 20 minutes walk from Marton Station (following The Grove).

It will be possible to leave luggage at the accommodation once the team arrive, which we anticipate being 4pm. Registration will open at 4:30 and will close before the Commissioning Service - late arrivals will be able to register later in the evening.

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DAY 2 Sunday August 16 Middlesbrough to Kirklevington 10.4 miles

LEADER: Mark Potter & Danny Thomas

Our first walking day starts with just a half-hour walk from Marton Methodist Church to the Roman Catholic Cathedral for 10.00 a.m. Mass. After Mass, we walk along pavements (mostly by a main ring road as the roads through the nearby housing estate are unsuitable). Lunch will be in Stainton village at the Stainton Inn. Sandwiches can be eaten in the churchyard nearby, where we have a prayer stop after lunch. After prayers we walk through the village to Thornton where we leave the road to walk through fields. Then, after 800 mtrs of road walking, we start what will mainly be a route along paths and tracks passing through the villages of Hilton (where we have a prayer stop) and then Middleton-on-Leven. After Middleton the path is through woods, above the River Leven and, in some places, can be narrow, steep in descent, uneven and muddy. A walking pole may be useful! After this we have a longish but relatively quiet road to the outskirts of Kirklevington, where a bridleway and village road take us to our overnight stop.

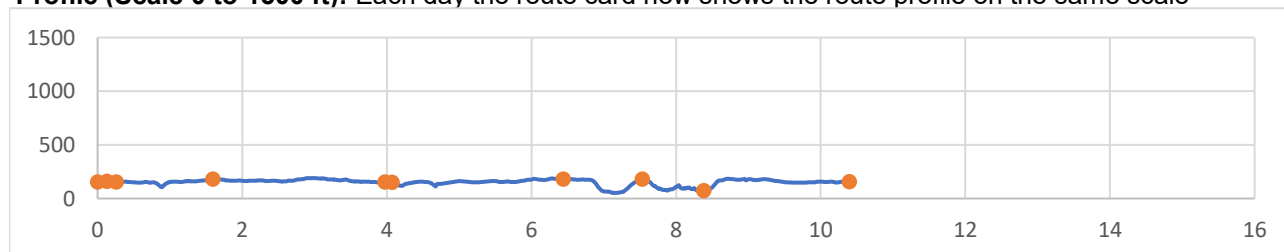

DAY 3 Monday August 17 Kirklevington to Croft-on-Tees 11.8 miles

LEADER: Sue & Fred Adilz

Maps: L93 or E304

The morning walk traverses farmland with church stops at Worsall and Girsby. Please shut gates when we pass through Fardeanside farmyard. We descend to cross the River Tees at Girsby Bridge into the ceremonial County of Durham at the Sockburn peninsula. We walk along Sockburn lane, joining the Teesdale Way. Beware of Giant Hogweed on the river path into Neasham. After lunch we walk along the road to Hurworth on Tees, where there is a memorial to plague victims on the village green. Following the Teesdale Way, the walk crosses back over the river at Croft-on-Tees. Take great care when crossing the main road here for prayers at the medieval church of St Peter, where Lewis Carroll's father was once Rector. A replica of the "Conyers Falchion" sword, used to slay the legendary "Sockburn Worm", is presented to new Bishops of Durham, on entry to the Diocese at the bridge at Croft-on-Tees.

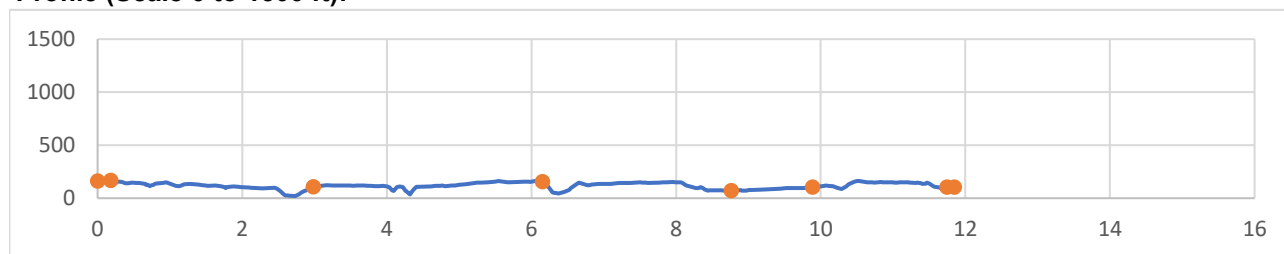

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DAY 4 Tuesday August 18 Croft-on-Tees to Richmond 15.7 miles

LEADER: John & Louise Chenery

Maps: L93,L92 or E304

This is a varied walk with a spectacular end. The first 4.5 miles of the route to North Cowton is quite intricate as we cross farmland, lots of fields and stiles, passing right by the Croft Motor Racing Circuit. North Cowton has no church so we have arranged a stop in the village hall. After North Cowton, we take a bridleway for 2.5 miles, passing woods and with wide open views, and then a quiet straight road leads us to a prayer stop in Scorton. Soon after Scorton, we start following a path along the River Swale, diverting away from it for a late lunch in the very large The Farmers Arms. After lunch we follow the riverside path under the A1(M) and to reach a prayer stop in Brompton-on-Swale. Then it is tracks and paths and a bit of road to reach the ruins of Easby Abbey and a prayer stop in the adjacent church. A stretch along or close to the river takes us to the famous Richmond Waterfall and then beneath the defences of Richmond Castle. Finally we ascend a long flight of steps to reach the large market square of Richmond from where it is a short walk to the hall.

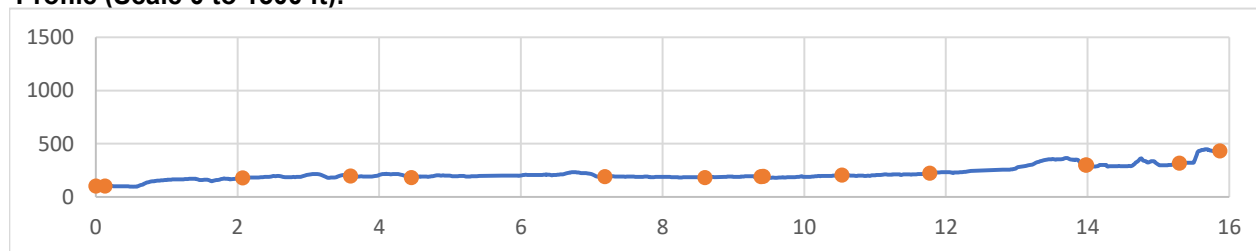

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DAY 5 Wednesday August 19 Richmond to Bedale 14.4 miles

LEADER: Richard Morris

After Mass in St Joseph and St Francis Xavier church we descend the hill down to the river Swale. We walk alongside the river and past Richmond's "jewel in the crown" - their waterfall. Crossing the river on the road bridge, we then follow the river out of Richmond. Soon we are crossing countryside - if it is sunny expect to see sheep huddled in the shade of large trees. The next urban area is Colburn where we pass a small well stocked shop selling ice-creams and cold drinks before reaching St Cuthbert's church for a prayer stop. They have a loo. The next stage involves crossing a ford so be careful of wobbly stepping stones and, if you have them, use poles or at least go across in pairs. You may get wet feet if you aren't careful! Our next prayer stop is in Holy Trinity church in Tunstall. Our next stage is to go to the Greyhound Inn in Hackforth. You may see, and walk close to, many deer on the farms along the way. We expect to arrive at 14:15 and the landlord has agreed for us to eat our sandwiches inside the pub or order food off their menu (it includes pizzas). The route to Great Crakehall is along small country roads with some blind bends and small hills so take care. The prayer stop will be in St Gregory's church (that also has a loo). The final stage to Bedale is across countryside, a railway line (don't forget to "Stop, Look, Listen") and along the edge of a sports field. We expect to arrive at Bedale's St Gregory's Church around 17:30.

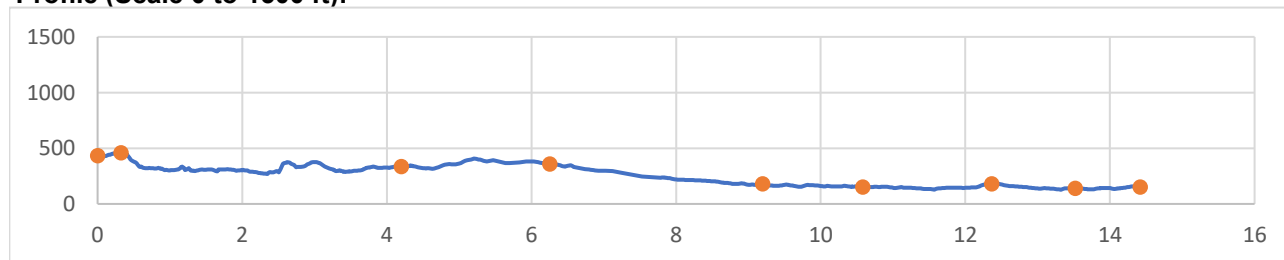

The day starts with a road walk to the local Catholic church then backtracking down to the scenery by the River Wharfe and the ancient church of St Michael and All Angels. More classic Dales landscape as we climb out of the river valley and across the farmland to Cracow. A huge quarry is visible to the north (we cross its rail line later). Many places are closed on Mondays but Jacksons farm shop has opened for us and will cook light meals. Onward through Rylstone and down beside Hetton Beck to the Flasby Estate where we turn south east and slog up the slopes to Sharp Haw. Downward again over moorland and around holiday parks to cross the busy A65. Another hill then Skipton is below.

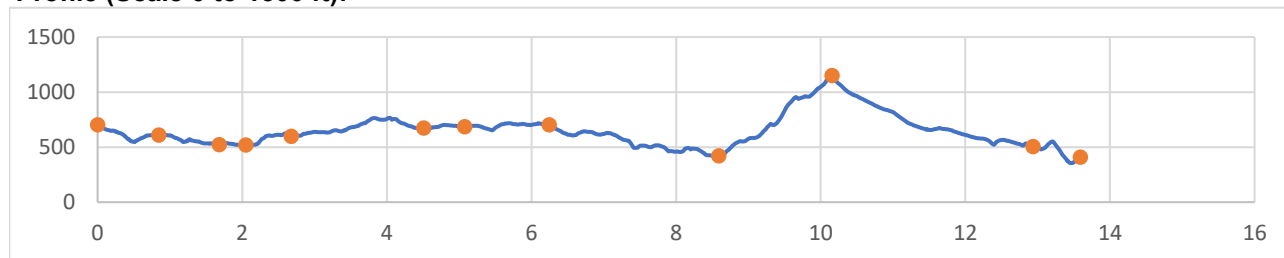

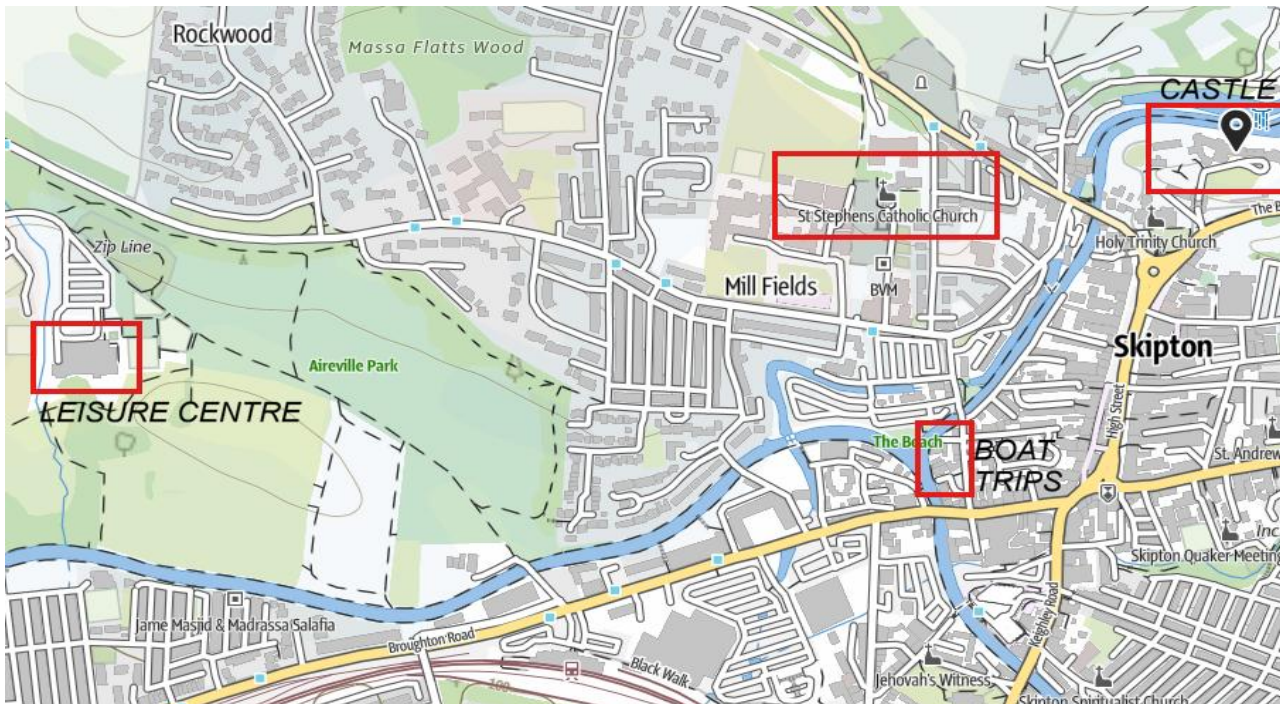
Other attractions include Skipton Castle, boat trips on the Canal, Craven Museum. There's a Visitor Centre in the High Street, 1/4 mile away.

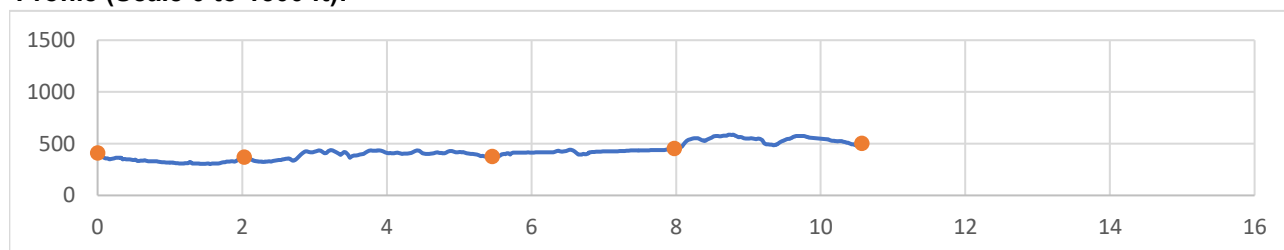

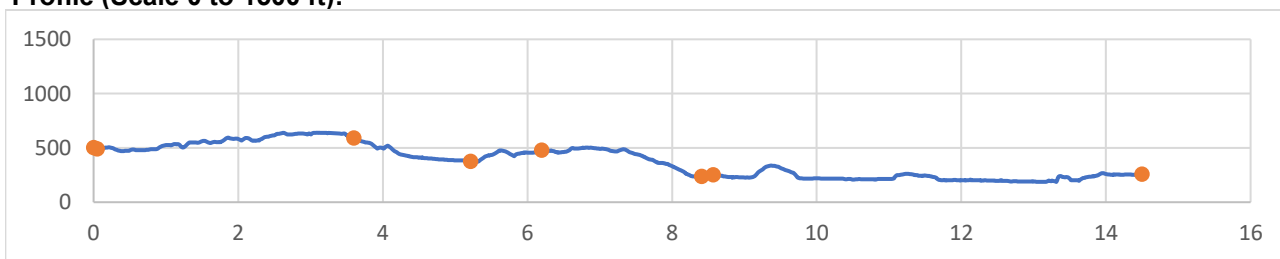

One of the harder days of the Roses pilgrimage has been saved for the end. We head out of Clitheroe past former cotton mills, which once dominated the town, following the river Ribble south before crossing at Mitton bridge to Great Mitton church. We need to take great care walking along the main road to Lower Hodder Bridge before we follow a quieter road up to Stonyhurst College, a leading Catholic boarding school. There is tight security at the school, so we will need to keep together for lunch, a guided tour of its museum and historic library followed by Mass in the Sodality Chapel.

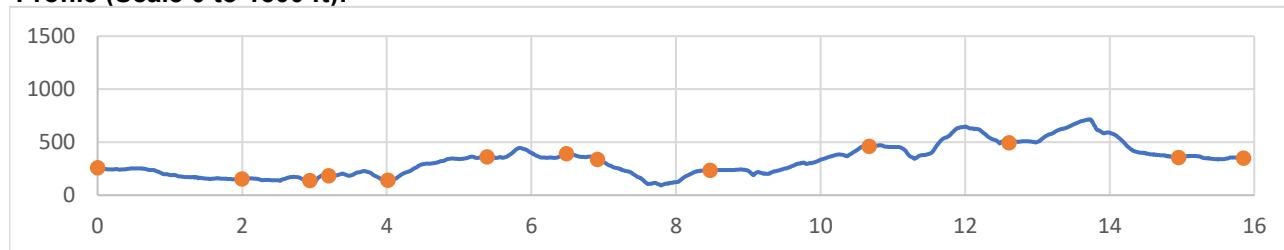

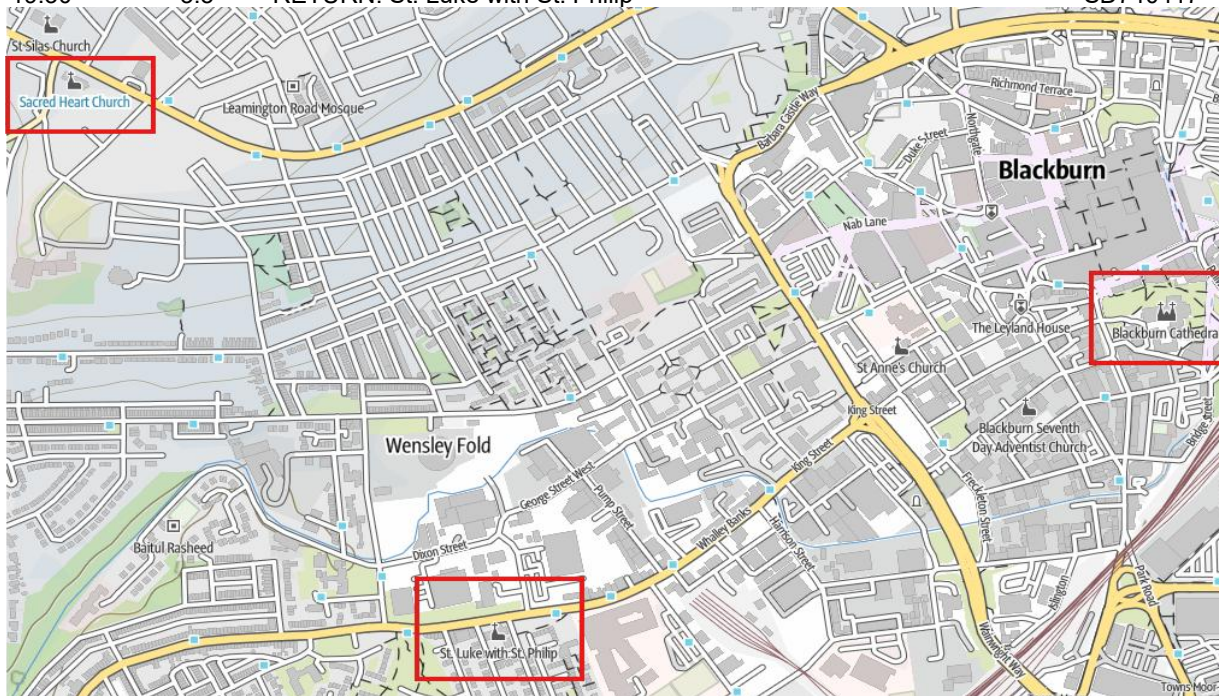
